Information, Advice & Guidance

The Government expects all young people to be in some form of education or training until at least their 18th birthday. This could mean undertaking a traineeship, an apprenticeship or studying at a further education college, sixth form, or with an independent training provider. There are several sources of support to help young people find and secure suitable education or training.

Schools must provide independent careers guidance to their students. Ask your school or check their website for details of their careers programme and contacts.

Bexley Youth Advice (BYA) on the Bexleyheath Broadway is a service that provides support, information, advice and guidance on a wide range of topics for young people aged 13 to 19 (up to 25 for young people with an Education, Health and Care Plan). Advisers can provide young people aged 16-18 not in education and training with information, advice, guidance and support to find and access a post-16 education or training place. They can also signpost or refer young people to a range of agencies who can offer support with health and well-being. BYA can be contacted on 0203 045 5555 or by emailing BYA@ prospects.co.uk

The National Careers Service can help young people aged 13 or over and looking for information and advice to plan their future. Their friendly advisers can provide information on learning, work, apprenticeships and choices on the right place to study. Advice is also available on subject choices in school Years 9 and 11, as well as lots of other careers and learning related issues. Applying for post-16 placements with an EHCP

If a young person has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) they will have a SEN Case Officer from their local authority. When applying for a place at a college, sixth form or other training provider you must contact your SEN Case Officer at the earliest possible time to tell them where you would like to apply. They can then work with the place applied to, to ensure that the education is suitable and that the provider can meet the needs outlined in the EHCP.

It is important to begin this process early, as places for young people with EHCPs should be agreed by 31 March. If you are unsure who your SEN Case Officer is, please contact the SENCO at your current setting or refer to the local authority's local offer website where contact details are provided.

Choosing the right pathway for you

Your options

There are many pathways to choose from following GCSEs. Making the right decision requires careful consideration of interests, how you best learn and your future aspirations. It may also mean studying at a different place than you did for GCSEs.

Regardless of what you choose, it is a requirement for all young people who did not achieved grade 4 or higher in English and / or maths at GCSE to continue their study in these subjects.

How to choose?

You may already have an idea about your future journey, such as going to higher education or into a particular career. Some careers and university courses require you to have qualifications in specific subjects. Chat with your school's careers adviser - based on your talents and needs, they can advise to help you make an informed decision.

The following checklist may be useful for you to consider when thinking about which pathway is right for you:

- ► How does the course build on your strengths and interests?
- ► What will you be doing on the course and what will the workload be like?
- ► Where will the course lead you to, and how do you think the qualification will bring you closer to your career goals?
- ► What will you need to do in order to achieve a good result?
- ► Is there someone you know who you can talk to about this option?
- ► Are there any other similar opportunities you could consider?

Your choices

When you are making your subject and qualification choices there are certain questions that you need to ask:

1) What is it?

- ► What is the qualification? (e.g. A Level, T level, GCSE, BTEC Subsidiary Diploma)
- ▶ What is the subject?

2) Where will I learn?

- ▶ In a classroom, a lab, in the workplace etc...?
- ➤ At a school sixth form, at a sixth form college, at a further education college, with a work-based training provider?

3) How will I learn / be assessed?

- ➤ Will there be lots of practical sessions, hands-on work, essays etc.?
- ► Will my learning be assessed through exams, coursework, portfolios, on the job etc...?
- ► What will the subject actually cover / what is the content?

4) Why should I study for this qualification?

- ➤ Will it help me do the things I want to do in the future?
- ➤ What is the progression from this qualification (e.g. is there something similar available at the next level)?
- ▶ Is it something I enjoy and I'm good at?
- ► Am I prepared to put in the hard work to get a good grade?
- ▶ Does it fit with my other choices and complement them?
- ➤ Will this course help me develop skills for the future?

5) Anything else?

- ➤ Am I eligible for this course (e.g. do I have the right grades / previous types of qualifications to get in)?
- ▶ Will this course provide opportunities for me to get work experience, etc.?
- ▶ Does this course make the most of the skills that I am good at?
- ▶ Does this course link to hobbies that I am interested in?

If you do not achieve a GCSE grade 4 or higher in English or maths, or an equivalent level 2 qualification (such as Functional Skills), you will continue studying these subjects in post-16 education to achieve a GCSE grade 4 equivalent qualification before the age of 19.

Sixth forms, colleges and apprenticeships may have specific entry requirements for individual subjects and courses, and some subjects have higher entry requirements than others. Specific entry requirements will be detailed on the course page on the provider's website or in their prospectus.

Where can you study or train?

At the end of year 11 you have a number of choices of where to study. It is worth doing some research into the ones you are interested in; you can find information on the internet, as most education and training providers have a website. You can also attend open days or taster days to see what it's really like and whether you think its right for you.

School sixth forms

Schools sixth forms primarily teach A levels but some may offer vocational courses such as BTECs at level 3. They also offer resits in GCSE maths and English for young people who didn't achieve a grade 4 or above.

School sixth forms are smaller than most sixth form colleges and further education colleges.

You don't usually have to wear school uniform, but smart clothing may be required and you will need to attend every day.

Sixth form colleges

Sixth form colleges are for 16 to 19 year olds. They have on average 1,200 students studying entry level up to A levels and BTEC nationals.

They offer a wide range of courses including applied courses.

Further education colleges (FE colleges)

FE colleges offer a broad range of courses at all different levels including entry level, ESOL, GCSEs, A levels, T levels, BTECs, traineeships, apprenticeships and vocational and occupational courses.

There is no upper age limitand there can be 1,000s of students on site. They may also have more than one site.

Independent training providers

If you did not gain any qualifications in year 11 you may need to take some short courses or combine education with employment or work experience.

There are a number of independent training providers in and around the borough that can offer courses in a wide range of subjects from hairdressing to football association coaching badges.

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships give you the opportunity to work, learn and earn all at the same time.

You will work for an employer alongside other experienced staff. You will be earning a salary, gaining valuable work experience and employability skills, and you will gain a qualification.

There are over 600 apprenticeship standards approved for study, from advertising to youth work and environmental engineering and nuclear decommissioning.

Types of apprenticeship

You can apply for different types of apprenticeship based on your current skills and qualifications

- ► Intermediate level (level 2)
- ► Advanced level (level 3)
- ► Higher level (level 4 or above)

Higher and degree apprenticeships mean more specialised and highly skilled apprenticeships are being offered each year.

When can I start an apprenticeship?

If you live in England and are aged 16 or over, you can apply to be an apprentice. You can start an apprenticeship on the first day after the last Friday in June (official school leaving date in England) as long as you are 16 or become 16 before 1 September of that year. You'll need to live in England and not be in full-time education.

How much will I earn?

The current national minimum wage for apprentices aged 16 to 18 is £4.30 per hour. The rate changes on 1 April every year so will likely be higher by the time a young person leaves school. Apprenticeship salaries are shown alongside the job description, so you'll know how much each opportunity will pay.

Training and qualifications

During your apprenticeship you will also receive training to gain a nationally recognised qualification in your chosen area. Your employer will be working with your training provider to ensure the programme is structured to support you to gain the skills you need for the job.

How do I find and apply for an apprenticeship?

The simplest way is to use the Find Apprenticeship Service. You'll need to create an account, and set preferences before applying, usually by completing an online application form and answering a few questions set by the employer. This resource is available at www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship.

Bexley hosts an annual apprenticeship event that typically takes place in February or March. Details of the event will be available at **www.bexley.gov.uk/apprenticeshipevent** along with information on local apprenticeship training providers and opportunities.



Financial support

As a 16 to 19 year old student you may be able to get help with money. There are different types of funding you may be able to claim.

16 to 19 bursary fund

There are two types of 16 to 19 bursary:

Vulnerable student bursary

You could get a bursary worth up to £1,200, depending on your circumstances.

This group includes:

- ▶ People in care
- ▶ Care leavers
- ▶ People claiming income support
- ▶ Disabled young people who receive Employment Support Allowance and Disability Living Allowance

Discretionary bursary

You could get a discretionary bursary if you need financial help but don't qualify for a vulnerable student bursary. Your education or training provider decides how much you get and what it's used for.

How is your bursary paid?

Your education or training provider will decide how you get your bursary. You might be:

- ▶ Paid in full or in instalments
- Paid in cash, by cheque or through a bank account
- ► Given things like a travel pass, free meals or books instead of money

Some providers also offer one off payments to cover study trips or travel for university interviews. Your provider will set conditions that students should meet to receive a bursary, for example, linked to behaviour or attendance and your bursary can be stopped if you break the rules.

Benefits

The general rule on benefits is that if you are under 18 you cannot make a claim for any benefits. Your parents / carers will still get child benefit or other benefits they already receive as long as you are under 19 and in full time education. If you are not in suitable education, their child benefit may be stopped.

If you are living away from your parents out of necessity, or have a family to support, you may be able to make a claim.

Care to Learn

You can claim Care to Learn if you are under 20, caring for your own child and doing a publicly funded course or training programme at school or college (fathers are eligible if they are the main carer).
